



Funds may be given as a loan or a gift, depending upon the person's ability and the circumstances. The minister has discretionary and confidential use of these funds within guidelines.

UUCLV Board of Trustees Meeting July 16, 2019 Minutes

Call to Order: The meeting was called to order by President Bruce Turner at 6:30 p.m. at the church. Also attending were Keith McMillen, Hilary Horwath, Kathy Espin, Dave Richards and Rev. Rachel Baker. A quorum was met.

Guest: Karin Metcalf

Agenda: There were no changes to the agenda

Chalice lighting: by Rev. Rachel Baker

Personnel and Compensation: Karin Metcalf reported that new guidelines from UUA require that the congregation offer benefits to the Office Administrator. Discussion on this matter was postponed until there is a firmer idea of how much money is available for such benefits. A motion by Keith to postpone the discussion until after a combined meeting between the finance and personnel committees can make a recommendation was seconded and passed by unanimous vote.

Review of Action Items:

- Bruce is working on moving the BLM banner.
- Hilary contacted a potential donor, no response.
- Kathy contacted a potential donor, the answer was no.
- Rev. Rachel was to post a report on Thursday before the meeting.

Approval of the minutes: Delayed until a copy could be located. Approval of the minutes of the annual meeting was delayed for the same reason.

New minutes approval committee: Bruce, Rev. Rachel, Keith

Reports

Minister

- The new music positions have been officially accepted and the new Accompanist and Song/Choir Leader will be introduced on Sunday, July 21.
- The minister will attend the UU Music Ministries Song Leaders Convergence in Denver. As request to send the new song leader also was denied.
- Whole Congregation Worship began a little earlier than expected due to an early resignation by the Faith Development Leader. The new service seems to be going well. Rev. Rachel requested that we refer any feedback from the congregation to her.
- Rev. Rachel suggested all board members develop a list of responsibilities and that we set up a working meeting for this activity.
- She requested moving the finance and board meetings to Thursday. No action was taken.

Finance

However: back payments for trash pickup of approximately \$2,500 are due and Tower Lease income for June has not come in yet.

Vice President – Absent, no report

Special Committees

- The application is due for the Pride Parade to be held on Oct. 11. Hilary will post notices on the Hangout and in the newsletter to gage interest in the event.
- It was established that there needs to be at least three congregation members involved in planning any event.
- There was a discussion of the difference between standing committees and special committees. Hilary is the liaison for special committees and Dave is liaison for standing committees.

Facilities – No liaison was present. Several board members mentioned items related to facilities

- The AC in the lobby and office is not working, a repair person is to come on Wednesday
- The water bill was drastically reduced this month, from more than 10,000 gallons to less than 5.000
- The bad smell has not been detected in several weeks.
- A new facilities committee is being recruited.

New procedures for consent agenda

Bruce proposed that board member reports be submitted in writing before each meeting and adopted by consent after questions are addressed. Rev. Rachel will provide him information on consent agendas to help develop the idea. The proposal was postponed to next meeting.

Old Business - No old business was presented.

New business

- BOT retreat planning
 - o The suggested dates for the Board Retreat is Aug. 15, 16 from 5:30 to 8:30 p.m.
 - Kathy will contact VP Nancy Czar to see if that fits her schedule
 - It was suggested that, in the future, we hold the board retreat shortly after the board elections and include out-going board members.
 - o Rev. Rachel will ask out regional UUA contact if she would like to join us.
 - Hilary volunteered to hold the retreat at her house.
 - o Bruce will meet with Rev. Rachel for further retreat planning.
- Other: the thermostat in the food bank storage is set at 80 degrees. Dave will turn it down and Keith will mention to food bank organizers to make sure the AC is turned off when not needed.

- Will put the proposed board retreat on the church calendar.

On September 20, three days before the UN Climate Summit in NYC, young people and adults will strike all across the US and the world to demand transformative action be taken to address the climate crisis. We know governments won't deliver climate action and justice on their own, so we're going on #climatestrike to show them what people power is capable of creating. The strikes are just the beginning of an escalated movement where millions will take to the streets to demand action now, especially for those most impacted by climate change who have done the least to cause it. Climate breakdown isn't inevitable. We know the solutions we need including a just transition away from the exploitative fossil fuel economy. - A group of UU ministers led by Rev. Peggy Clarke, Senior Minister at The Community Church
 of New York Unitarian Universalist, have put together an excellent packet of worship materials
 for Worship Services on or before September 15 on the Global Climate Strikes as well as
 an informational flyer on the Strikes and the many ways we can participate.
- UU Conference Advancing Economic and Climate Justice as a Moral Issue: Building a
 Movement for a Green New Deal Sept 15 17 in Washington, DC. Come for the first day
 at All Souls Unitarian Church to hear from some amazing speakers from our most impacted
 communities and learn about actions we can take or stay for the next day or two to get
 trained in advocacy and visit congressional representatives. Learn more and register now.

Join us! You can sign up for a strike in your area or get coached on how to start one.

We know that each of the guiding principles of our faith and our campaigns for justice are unattainable in the face of widespread climate injustice and chaos. The current US government centers the rights of corporations over people, other species and Earth. It sanctions state violence to protect the fossil fuel industry gains and it criminalizes water protectors, climate protesters, and indigenous peoples. It persecutes climate refugees through cruel, harsh immigration policies. It perpetuates environmental racism. We are called to engage this at every level possible. We can bring our vision, our resources and ourselves into relationship with communities most impacted who are leading the way into sustainable and equitable futures.

Please join us for this crucial event on Sept. 20th. It is just the beginning of a new climate movement built on the foundation of decades of climate justice work and activism. Organizers are actively planning strategies for now through November 2020 and beyond. UUs have always been there. We are still needed now, more than ever.

Enrollment Instructions

- You must have a registered Smith's rewards card to enroll in the Smith's Inspiring Donations program.

- If you do not yet have a Smith's rewards card, they are available at the customer service desk at any Smith's store.
